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Proc 2020 adds high-tech TEKS

At its April meeting, the State Board of Education added a requirement to Proclamation 2020 that all digital offerings include machinereadable TEKS.

In an IMCAT webcast May 1, Dr. Anne Boothe of Houston ISD explained that TEA had worked on a program to put the curriculum standards into a format that could be understood in a number of different platforms and applications.

Putting the requirement into Proclamation 2020, which includes high school English and Language Arts instructional materials, is a major step toward matching materials

with personalized education needs of students, she said.

A recording of the IMCAT webcast is available on the association's website, **www.imcat.org**.

SBOE Chair Donna Bahorich hailed her colleagues' decision.

"The requirement to use our digitized TEKS in Proclamation 2020 is the first necessary step toward insisting educational publishers utilize a common technical 'language' for their content—an urgent need for transparency and interoperability according to our Texas school districts and their teachers," she said.

"Publishers who continue to deliver content using proprietary platforms waste our schools' time and money. We require all of our schools to teach to our state's standards; it is high time we require all of our publishers to provide content in the technical standards that allow districts to finally seize the promise of technology in our classrooms."

Last year about 66 percent of the instructional materials ordered by Texas public schools were partially or completely digital, TEA said in a prepared release.

Proc 2020 materials using the digitized TEKS will come before the State Board for consideration in November 2019.

Our **Annual Conference**, set for Nov. 11-14 in Galveston, is our flagship event, and we want you all there.

That being said, I realize the conference is not possible for everyone. Budget constraints, distance, conflicting events: These are all potential barriers to attendance.

Membership in IMCAT is, however, doable for every instructional materials coordinator in the state at just \$40 a year.

I've set a goal of 425 members for our organization this year. That's a 27 percent increase over last year. I know we can do it and in an effort to spur us on, I will be engaging in a **"Tour of Texas"** hopefully to bring the message of IMCAT to every region in the state.

Be looking for a meeting in your region in the early fall. If you're already a member, be there to support and engage with others. If you know of coordinators who aren't part of our team, reach out and invite them to one of these meetings and encourage them to join IMCAT.

TEA announces 148 tech lending grants

AUSTIN – The Texas Education Agency (TEA) has announced that 148 school districts and charters have been awarded 2018–2019 Technology Lending grants, aimed at ensuring equitable access to quality digital resources and courses for all students.


Technology Lending grants provide school systems funds to purchase technology devices that are loaned to students for access to digital instruction materials off campus. The grant also provides personal student learning devices and internet access for students who would not otherwise have access to digital instructional materials off campus.

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Scholarship gives access to conference

Instructional materials coordinators who have never attended an IMCAT conference can apply for the the Russell Owen Memorial Scholarship for free registration to the conference...and more. Because the conference is earlier this year, deadline for application is Friday, Sept. 21, 2018.

That's a hard deadline. The IMCAT Board will consider applications at its meeting Monday, Sept. 24.

The IMCAT Russell Owen Memorial Scholarship honors instructional material coordinators who plan to pursue professional development and commemorates the achievements of an individual whose passion was public education and the students he served.

Russell Owen, a founder of IMCAT, served more than 30 years as an administrator for the Dallas Independent School District. His dedication to his students and his loyalty to IMCAT serve as an example to his colleagues today and to those who will follow in his footsteps.

At least one recipient from the Texas instructional materials community will be eligible for a scholarship award to IMCAT's 27th Annual Conference, Nov. 10-14 at the Moody Gardens Convention Center in Galveston.

The scholarship covers conference registration,

conference meals, three-nights hotel accommodations and up to \$100 reimbursement for approved travel expenses.

To be considered for the IMCAT Russell Owen Memorial Scholarship, an applicant must:

- be the instructional materials coordinator or directly involved in acquisition of instructional materials,
- declare intent to attend the entire IMCAT conference in November.
- have never attended an IMCAT conference before and • wishes to continue professional development, and
- provide a letter from a superintendent or director as to why applicant is being nominated to attend conference.


